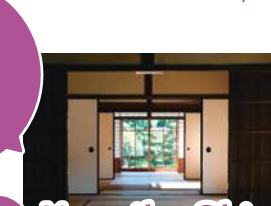

Founded in 1949 in Shinsekai Janjan Yokocho near Tsutenkaku Tower in Osaka. In 2008, the shop relocated to Higashiosaka, the owner's hometown. Large chunks of meat and vegetables are coated in a crispy yet fluffy batter and always served hot!
